Re: Suspended on Certain Cut-to-Length (CTL) Carbon Steel Plate from Ukraine

Dear Sergei:

On September 1, 2000, we sent you the export limit for November 1, 2000 through October 31, 2001, which is 147,985 metric tons. I wanted to inform you that we recalculated apparent domestic consumption, even though it does not effect the export limit. As we noted in the letter, due to the unavailability of current data, we estimated figures for domestic shipments of carbon-steel plate in coil to steel service centers for the second quarter of 2000. American Iron Steel Institute (AISI) has confirmed actual coil shipments to service centers were 243,877 metric tons. Therefore, the actual apparent domestic consumption of CTL steel plate products decreased by 14.5 percent not the 13.7 percent based on estimated coil shipments.

I just wanted to let you know of the actual numbers, however the export limit remains at 147,985 metric tons.
